It has a warm inscription by the author, calling Jim "a compassionate man" for his work on protecting chimpanzees. (4) William Ayers, A Kind and Just Parent: The Children's Juvenile Court, Beacon Press, 1997. Jim is at the same conference in Europe now--auspices of a private group. "He goes to a lot of conferences abroad. He's the child advocate, the person who worries and talks about the family." (5) To Renew America, Newt Gingrich, Harper Collins, 1995. "He takes that book with him and takes it very seriously."
