"Re clothespins - "Bill talked to Brock on Tuesday and Brock said
'everybody I know is against it.' So maybe they'll scale it back more to
satisfy the free traders. It's hard to understand. It's such a trying
thing. It makes you wonder what we're going to get after AWACS. We're still
getting trouble from that—from the Jewish Community. But every little thing
we want we don't get."

He said that they had press release ready and had been expecting an announcement any time. The phase out over three years was what they expected. He said they had had some interest in the papers and a CBS story on TV re the West Paris plant. Almost a human interest story they are so small and so important to small towns.
