His Budget Committee meets everyday—while all this was going on in his office, Lou was talking to me about getting him back home.

"How do you know where he should go when he goes home." We tried to chart his trips and it looked like a spaghetti bowl. How much do you get out of each particular visit. I want him to go home and see the little people. The problem is that unless you work at it, he will see the same people he always sees and rely on the media to reach the others. Those are the same 5% that know what he's doing in Washington and like the fact that he's a national senator. But 95% of the people of New Mexico will never leave New Mexico. They'll never see Washington, D.C. Those are the people I want him to go and see—even if there's no media. And in a lot of those little towns, there is no media—they are dead areas for the media.
